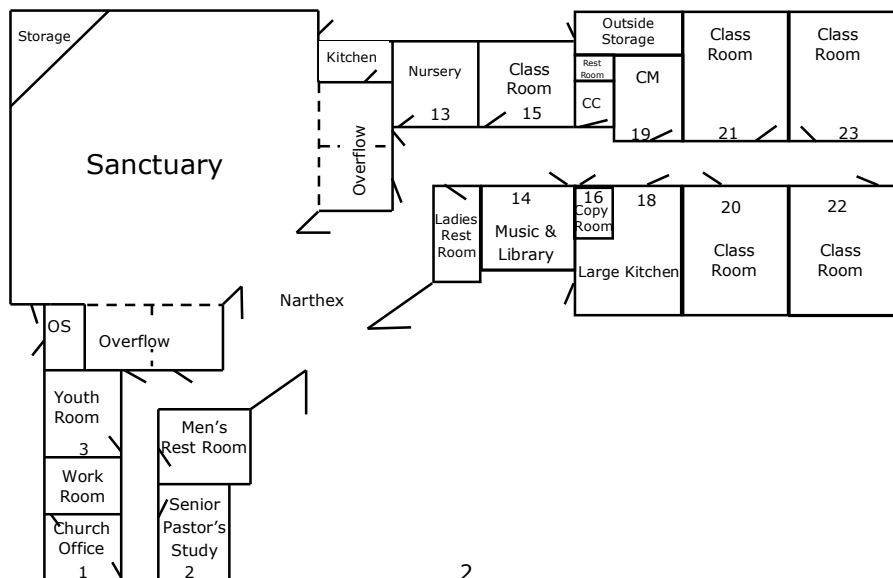

The Affirmation of Faith

Heidelberg Catechism 31-32

Leader: Why is he called "Christ," meaning "anointed"?
