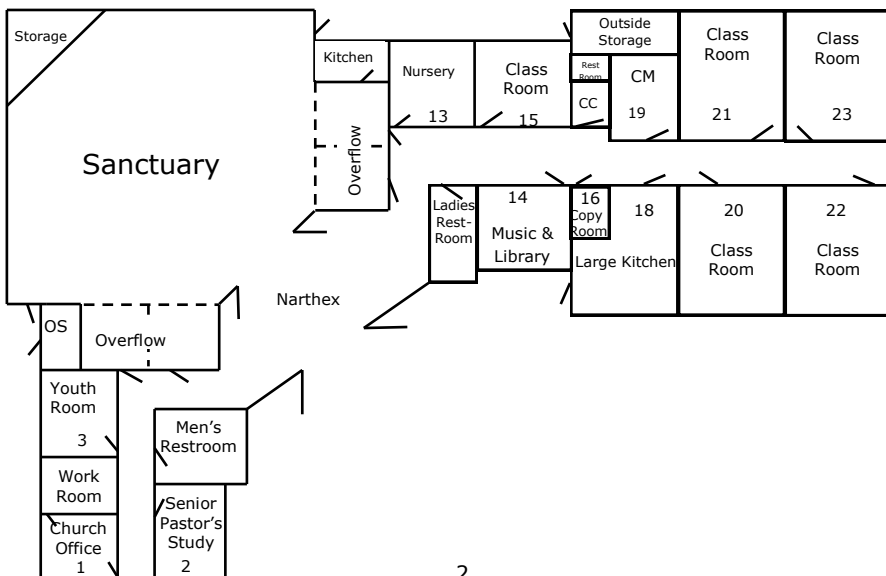
During Sunday morning worship and Sunday school, childcare is provided for infants to age two in room 13.
