## Sunday Morning Schedule

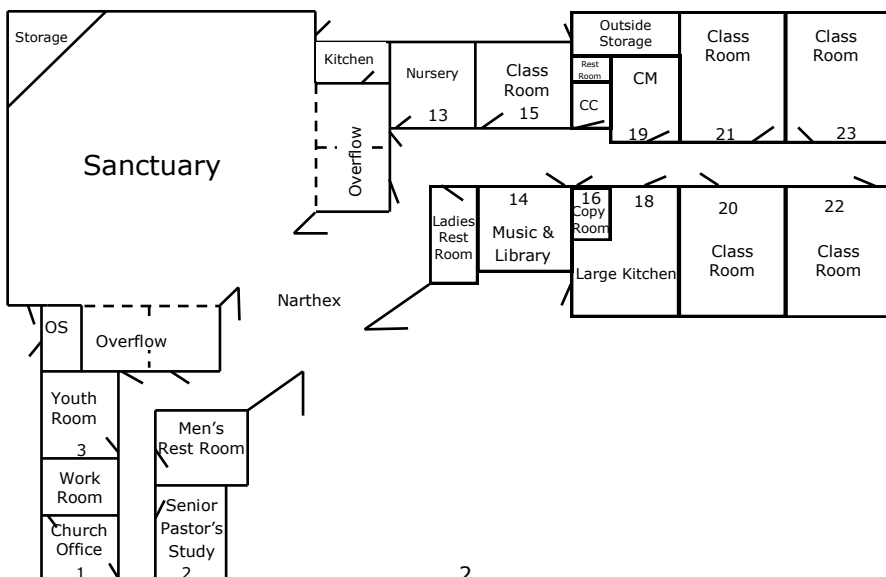
Sunday School (all ages) - 9:00 a.m.
