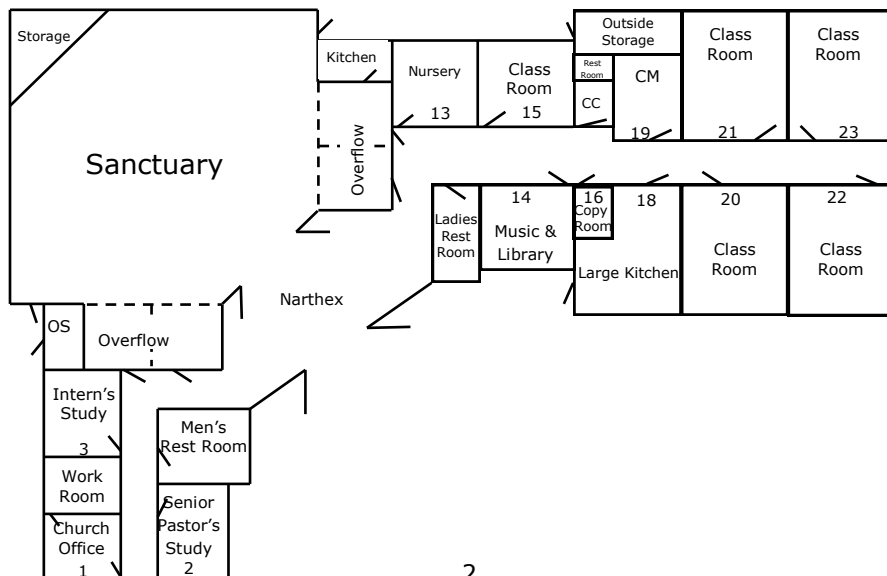
Worship—10:30 a.m.

In this country it was encouraging to see that a mature storying network is in place, with national mother-tongue speakers running the entire project. Please pray that the church in their assigned country will catch the same vision and that the foreign workers will be humble and willing to listen to the needs and goals of the local churches. They also ask for prayers for opportunities and boldness to “give the reason for the hope that [we] have” (I Pet. 3:15) with their friends and neighbors

Esaie & Natacha Etienne: Esaie praises God for the recent medical clinic in Gonaives, led by a PCA doctor from Birmingham; nearly 1,000 patients were seen during the week. The construction of the 2-story school in Docine is proceeding well; all the structural construction is completed, save the roof. Prayer requests: 1) more consistent leadership training at the seminary; for two US pastors who are working to address this issue. 2) for the leaders of both Trinity Presbyterian (Gonaives) and Docine Presbyterian to be more committed and faithful in handling their responsibilities. 3) for safety in monthly travel between FL and Haiti. 4) for the building of a children’s home that would be a model for all children homes in the country – planning for success of this big project.
