Sunday Morning Schedule

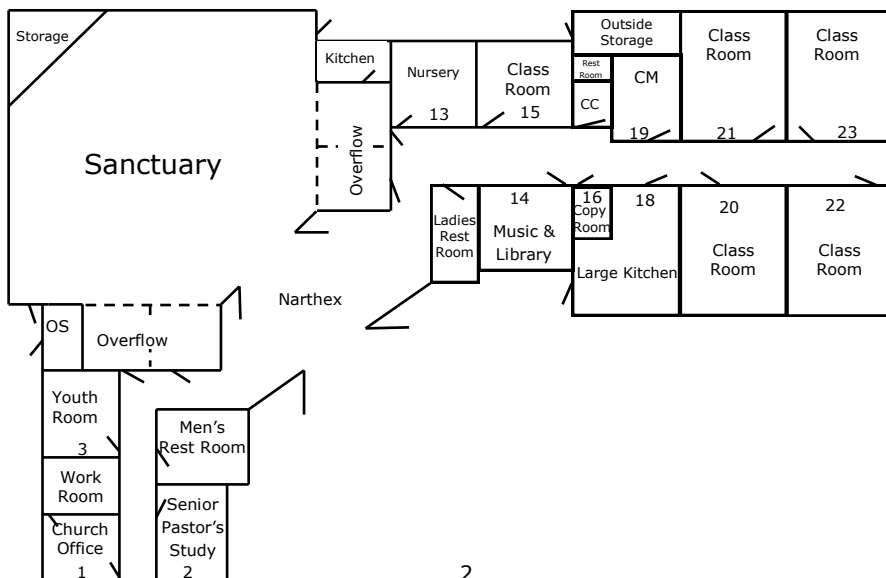
Sunday School (all ages) - 9:00 a.m.

The Affirmation of Faith

Westminster Shorter Catechism #33-36

Leader: What is justification?

People: Justification is the act of God's free grace by which he pardons all our sins and accepts us as righteous in his sight. He does so only because he counts the righteousness of Christ as ours. Justification is received by faith alone.

Leader: What is adoption?

Jeff & Jenny Lee: Update on the Spring Break Mission Trip to Jamaica: Jeff took 9 students to Kingston for a week to serve at the Caribbean Christian Center for the Deaf. The campus has 75 students ranging in age from 5-20. The RUF students worked on a new wing of dorms/apartments under con-

struction; doing cleaning, painting, and some concrete work. The students learned some sign language while there to communicate with the deaf, building relationships in the process! Jeff and the RUF students are grateful for the experience. Pray with Jeff that the team members will continue to grow in their relationship with Christ.
