Sunday School (all ages) - 9:00 a.m.

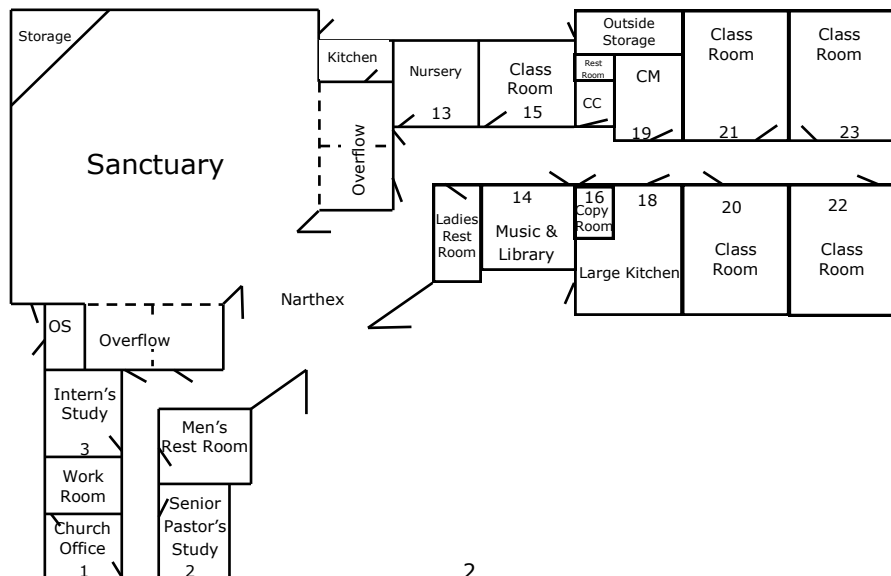
Worship—10:30 a.m.

- Ken & Tammie Matlack:** As the Matlacks review 2010 they see much MTW team progress being made in Berlin, where they were posted for many years. There have been visits to MTW teams in England, Romania, Czech Republic, and Bulgaria. They have also been exploring ministry opportunities in Belgium and Holland. They note that they have an annual shortfall in their personal support budget of \$12,000. They ask for prayer as they continue recruiting additional missionaries for new ministry fields in Europe and for safety in their travel throughout Europe and to/from the U.S.
- Esaie & Natacha Etienne:** Esaie rejoices in the recent successful election of a new president of Haiti. He also notes some statistics that demonstrate the challenges the nation faces: unemployment at 80% (was 70% pre-quake); 500K-800K school children out of school (500K pre-quake); 1M still home-

less, living in tent cities (1.5M immediately after quake.) His ministry is focused on church planting and, under that, education for kids. Praises: new well dug in Docine; construction of the school there has begun. Prayer needs: safe travel for Esaie to/from Haiti monthly; growth in maturity of the church leadership in Gonaives and Docine; financial support from U.S churches and individual donors for the ministry center in Gonaives.

Jeff & Jenny Lee: Update on the Spring Break Mission Trip to Jamaica: Jeff took 9 students to Kingston for a week to serve at the Caribbean Christian Center for the Deaf. The campus has 75 students ranging in age from 5-20. The RUF students worked on a new wing of dorms/apartments under construction, doing cleaning, painting, and some concrete work. The students learned some sign language while there to communicate with the deaf, building relationships in the process! Jeff and the RUF students are grateful for the experience. Pray with Jeff that the team members will continue to grow in their relationship with Christ. Please also pray for campus ministry efforts in evangelism and witnessing. Jeff is preaching through the Book of Ecclesiastes this semester to engage students in the questions of life.
