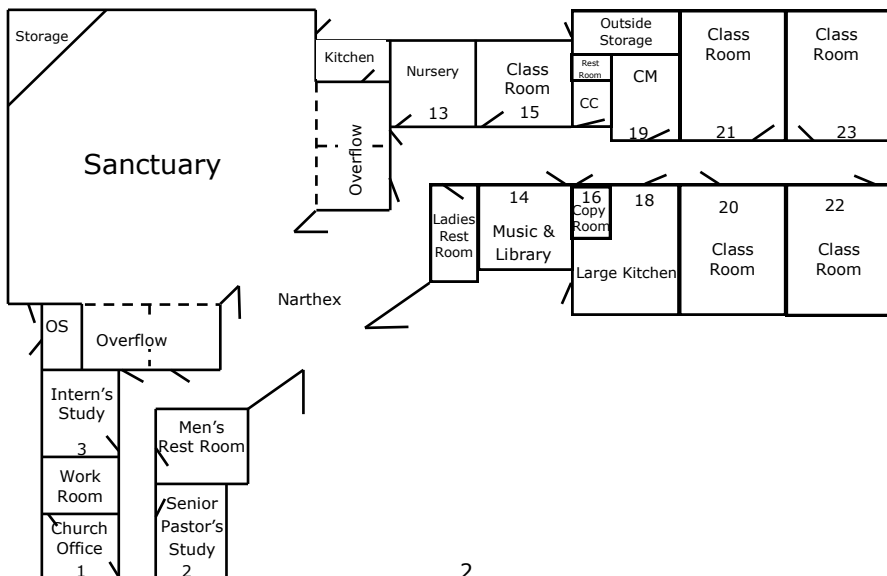
During Sunday Morning Worship and Sunday School, childcare is provided for infants to age two in room 13.
