Sunday Morning Schedule

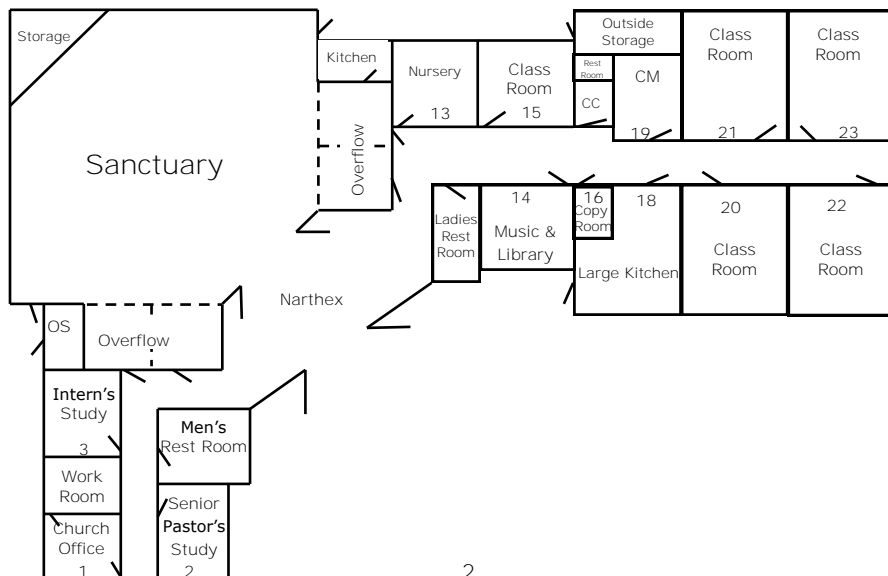
Sunday School (all ages) - 8:45 a.m.
