

I. Her accession was followed shortly by a new Act of Uniformity (April 1559) which re-adopted Edward's Second Prayer Book with several amendments, restoring language from the Words of Administration from the 1549 book to those of 1552.

Edward VI's *Book of Common Prayer* (1552)

Today's Worship Leaders: Freddy Fritz and Ed Jordan

To celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, we shall use several historic Orders of Worship this fall. Today's service is Edward VI's *Book of Common Prayer*.

The death of Henry VIII in 1547 brought his young, Protestant educated son Edward VI to the throne amidst continuing calls for reform within the Church of England. In 1549, the First Act of Uniformity and Prayer Book were adopted moving the church in a solidly Protestant direction. Regarded by historian A. G. Dickens as a "masterpiece of compromise," nevertheless its remaining vestiges of Romanism led Calvin to call for further reform. John Hooper rejected it as "very defective," and Martin Bucer responded to it with his 50-page *Censura*, urging the reduction of the Church Calendar, the elimination of "popish gestures" left over from the Mass, and a restoration of apostolic simplicity respecting all things external (e.g., priestly vestments).

Consequently, a second Prayer Book was prepared and approved with a new Act of Uniformity in 1552. It is not often appreciated that much of the Prayer Book was directly inspired by the continental Reformers. Nearly all of Bucer's criticisms were adopted. Ceremonies were reduced and vestments curtailed. "Altars" became "tables," and prayers for the dead eliminated. As Peter Martyr wrote to Bullinger, all that "could nourish superstition" was removed.

In the Communion service, the Introit disappeared, and the kyrie eleison and Gloria in excelsis were replaced by the Ten Commandments, a feature of all the Reformed liturgies. The Confession, Absolution, and Comfortable Words of the communion service, as well as the Thanksgiving of the Post-Communion service were taken from the *Cologne Liturgy* written jointly by Philip Melancthon and Martin Bucer. The first exhortation of the communion service (exhorting the negligent) was derived from Peter Martyr's *Ad horatio*. Even the Words of Distribution at the Lord's Supper were derived from the liturgy written by the Polish Reformer Jan Laski for use at the Stranger's Churches in London (made up of foreigners who had fled Roman Catholic persecution on the continent), which in turn was based upon Calvin's Strasbourg liturgy.

In addition, in the liturgy for Morning and Evening Prayer, the sequence of Scriptural Sentences, Exhortation, Confession, and Absolution was taken from Calvin's Strasbourg Liturgy. Finally, the forms for the Solemnization of Matrimony and the Order of the Burial of the Dead find their origins in the work of Bucer.

The Prayer Book of 1552 is a genuinely Protestant form of worship which received the guarded approbation of the Reformers, though Calvin judged that it still contained *multas tolerabiles ineptias* ("many bearable pieces of foolishness") and complained "that it did not possess that purity which was to be desired" (letter to the English in Frankfurt, January 13, 1555). Edward's death in July 1553 brought first his Roman Catholic sister "bloody" Mary to the throne, and with her a restoration of Romanism in England. After Mary came, the moderate Protestant Elizabeth
