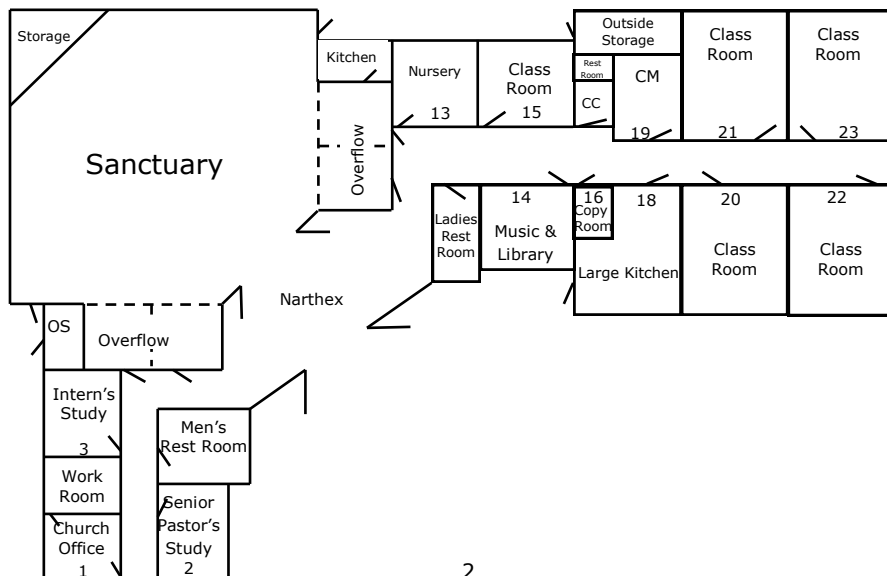
Worship—10:30 a.m.

For her hair is given to her for a covering. ¹⁶ If anyone is inclined to be contentious, we have no such practice, nor do the churches of God.

Research has demonstrated that reading the Bible on a daily basis is the number one predictor of spiritual maturity, but only 16% of those who regularly attend church do so. 25% of churchgoers don't read the Bible at all, and more than 50% only read their Bible occasionally. With such limited participation in this critical spiritual discipline, it is not surprising that "only 37% of those who attend church regularly say that reading and studying the Bible has made a significant difference in the way they live their lives." *Facts & Trends, Spring 2011, p.26*. How are you doing reading through the Scriptures? Many of you have taken the challenge of reading through the Bible in a Year. Please let Pastor Freddy know when your Bible reading is completed.
