Richard Baxter's *The Savory Liturgy* (1661)

Today's Worship Leader: Freddy Fritz

To celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, we shall use several historic Orders of Worship this fall. Today's service is Richard Baxter's *The Savory Liturgy* (1661).

The following service is based on *The Savoy Liturgy* (1661) written by Richard Baxter and the English Presbyterians at the invitation of the recently restored Stuart monarch, Charles II. Promising a religious settlement that would permit "liberty to tender consciences," and give "indulgence" to non-conformists, Charles called for an assembly of twelve Anglican bishops and twelve moderate Puritan divines to review and revise the Prayer Book and provide alternate forms of prayer that might be agreeable to dissenters. From March to July 1661 they met "without the slightest reconciliation having been achieved," says Bard Thompson. While not opposed to liturgy in principle and willing to tolerate Episcopacy and Erastianism (state control), nevertheless they objected to the use of collects, repetition, litany, ceremonies, Saints days, among other things, and sought a more consistently Protestant and scripturally sound liturgy. The response to their objections? "Frosty," said Thompson. The Puritan proposals were refused, and Baxter's liturgy rejected. The Act of Uniformity was enacted on August 24, 1662, and tragically, eighteen hundred Puritan ministers were removed from their churches, in what history calls the "Great Ejection," for refusing to conform to the requirements of the Prayer Book and Ordinal.

Thompson speaks of the "excellence of the Savoy Liturgy" as consisting of its "mood of adoration," its Scriptural absolution, and its "emphasis upon holiness of life;" in sum, it is "remarkably successful at the difficult task of building diverse phrases of Scripture into sustained orders of worship." It gives us a solid understanding of the liturgical views of the Presbyterian majority at the Westminster Assembly, freed from the need to compromise with the more radical independents and more rigorous Scots.

Worship headings in italics were not part of the *Savoy Liturgy*. This service is based on *The Savoy Liturgy* (1661), "The Ordinary Public Worship on the Lord's Day."
