I recently came across an interesting article about "Temptations and America's Favorite Sins."¹

God says that there are seven things that are an abomination to him: "haughty eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked plans, feet that make haste to run to evil, a false witness who breathes out lies, and one who sows discord among brothers" (Proverbs 6: 16-9).

The Barna Group found that among America's top temptations are the following:

- Gossiping (26% of Americans)
- Feeling jealous (24%)
- Viewing pornography (18%)
- Lying or cheating (12%)
- Abusing alcohol or drugs (11%), and
- Doing something sexually inappropriate (9%)

Men and women are tempted almost equally in many areas. However, the following differences in temptation were recorded:

- Viewing pornography (women=8%; men=28%)
- Gossiping (women=29%; men=22%)
- Worrying (women=68%; men

=50%)

- Overeating (women=58%; men=52%), and
- Overspending (women=39%; men=32%)

When asked the reason for giving in to temptation, the following responses were recorded:

- Don't know why (50%)
- Enjoy the sin (20%), and
- To escape "real life" (20%), and
- Our sinful nature (1%)

No one, of course, is immune to temptation. All of us deal with temptation on a regular basis in our lives. And sometimes the temptation is fierce. We may want to give in to temptation.

However, our God is faithful, "and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it" (1 Corinthians 10: 13).

How does he do it? The key is by looking to Christ and finding a greater satisfaction in him than in the particular temptation we are facing. Rather than

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Thoughts from the Intern

"[A]nd also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak." (Eph 6:19-20)

"At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison—that I may make it clear, which is how I ought to speak." (Col 4:3-4)

Look closely at what Paul is requesting prayer for in these verses. Keep in mind that Paul is probably the greatest evangelist of all time. In these two verses he asks for prayer for three things: bold proclamation of the gospel, open doors, and clarity of speech. This is the man who was repeatedly thrown into jail for his proclamation of the word. He knew how to evangelize and yet he recognized that God was in control and that he did not just "have it."

Many Christians that I have run into feel that they do not have what it takes to evangelize. They say that they do not have "the spiritual gift" and that they think that others are better at it. Yet we see that Christians are supposed to share their faith. Look at these:

"And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt 28:18-20)

"[B]ut in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect," (1 Peter 3:15)

We are commanded to share our faith and live lives that reflect Christ. So how do we reconcile sharing our faith when we feel under-equipped or unqualified? Well, April 7, 14, and 21 there will be evangelism training classes where you can find out. The class will run from 2-3 PM in the overflow classrooms and there will be childcare provided. Come find out how you, no matter who you are, can love those around you by sharing the gospel in ways that you may have never heard before. 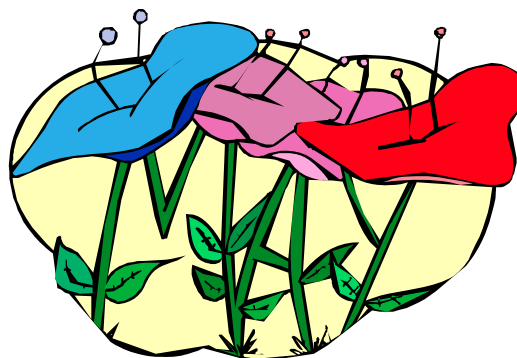

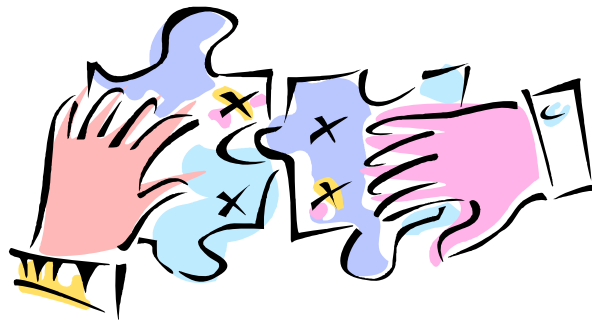

Truth Matters Today

*"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."
Genesis 1:27 (English Standard Version)*

Coy Mathis. Have you heard of him? He's nearly famous thanks to articles like the one in the New York Times last month.¹ The short story: Coy is a boy living in Colorado who has decided at the tender age of six—despite the very clear outward evidence to the contrary—that he is, in fact, a girl.

OK; why all the press interest? Because officials of his school district had more faith in his birth certificate than his judgment when they ruled he would not be allowed to use the girl's restroom at school. Though they granted him access to a private (i.e. "gender-neutral") restroom, Coy's parents pulled

him out of school until he is given unfettered access to the girl's restroom. The Transgender Legal Defense and Education Fund has taken legal action alleging discrimination against him under Colorado's new antidiscrimination law.

So many questions fill one's mind. What if another young boy woke up one morning convinced he was a man-eating super croc? Would legal action ensue if he was not allowed to dine on students and staff in the school cafeteria? Suppose a little girl decided she was in fact a championship race-car driver. Shouldn't she be allowed to drive on city streets or compete for the pole at the Saint Petersburg Grand Prix? Six-year olds aren't mature enough to drink or vote, but government agencies are expected to bow to their decisions regarding their gender?

A Growing Epidemic

Coy's definitely not alone on this front. There's Sasha Laxton, a British boy whose sex wasn't revealed by his parents for five years while they alternately dressed him as a boy and girl. Their explanation for such a parenting approach: "Why would you want to slot people into boxes?"² Far more disconcerting, other parents have decided it makes more sense to enable their children to change their bodies than change their minds, opting for surgery and steroids to give their offspring the outward appearance of the opposite sex to mirror the child's inward feelings.^{3,4}

Not surprisingly, government is moving toward increased gender neutrality as well. The U.S. Department of State issued a media note in December 2010 (later amended), that included an advisory that "U.S. passports...will...use the title of "parent" as opposed to "mother" and "father"...to provide a gender neutral description of...parents."⁵ And just last year, Massachusetts enacted a law focused on gender identity to enshrine the concept alongside "far better known terms like "race," "religion," "sex" and "national origin."⁶ Commerce, too, is bending toward the trans-gender lobby. Targeted by a gender-neutrality campaign, Britain's famous Hamley's toy store—established in 1760—buckled under 251 years later and eliminated separate sections for boys' and girls' toys.⁷

How Did We Get Here?

In truth, this boiling kettle has been simmering for a while. According to Dale O'Leary, the fire was ignited in the 1950s when John Hopkins University staffer John Money proffered a theory suggesting "sexual identity" wasn't tied only to physical attributes, DNA and hormones but also to gender, "the sex that the person identified with", to an equal or greater degree. He even claimed that a boy whose physical identifiers were deformed at birth wouldn't know the difference if the remaining portions of his male anatomy were surgically removed and he was raised as a girl. Money's theories were profes-

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sionally discredited in time, but not before they were exploited for a broader purpose. Seizing on his idea that the differences between men and women were not natural but notional, feminists used it to buttress their assertion that there should be absolutely no societal differences between the sexes either. Hamley's, for one, complied. It seems the neutrality campaign convinced them that having sex-specific toy-store areas was tantamount to "conditioning of children from an early age" and eventually contributes to poor chances for British women to attain powerful and influential positions in society.⁸ Blimey!

Boy Meets Girl?

Prompting a toy-store makeover is somewhat trivial. Toying with human bodies and minds to advance a social agenda is anything but. Yet since those who believe Money essentially equate males and females to identical gifts wrapped in paper of different designs, they see no reason why males shouldn't change into females or vice-versa. Paul McHugh, MD, disagrees. He joined the staff of Johns Hopkins as chair of the Department of Psychiatry and professor at their Bloomberg School of Public Health in the 1970s, a time when Hopkins was pioneering sex-change surgery.⁹ Discovering that many who underwent the surgery continued to have the emotional problems that prompted it, he became an ardent opponent, arguing "[w]e have wasted scientific and technical resources and damaged our professional credibility by collaborating with madness rather than trying to study, cure, and ultimately prevent it."¹⁰

What's the Deal?

He's right. After all, if you bought an old Ford Fiesta and managed to switch the outer shell with that of a Rolls Royce, would it be a Rolls? No, and you'd know it by the Ford emblem on the steering wheel and how it handled on the road. Why, then, would anyone think that having sex-change surgery would transform them into the opposite sex? It's not just the few external sexual organs and choice of clothing that defines someone's sex. It's also the chromosomes that are part of God's design in every single one of the *trillions* of cells in the human body.¹¹ No surgery can change that.¹²

So, why would so many, including self-professing Christians, opt to go down this senseless and virtually irreversible road? At the root, isn't this really an act of rebellion against the One who made them male and female? Reminds you of another infamous rebel:

"[Satan] said... 'I will make myself like the Most High.'" (Isaiah 14:13-14, ESV)

If you read the back of the book, you'll see trying to play God doesn't work out well for him either.

Eternal Life is a Solid Hope*

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the greatest event in human history. Not only does it declare loud and clear that

death has been conquered, but it also validates that Christ's sacrifice of His life on our behalf is sufficient, enabling forgiveness of our sins and release from sin's power and penalty. It further assures us that the Christian hope in eternal life is secure and guarantees that it is not a hollow fantasy.

Debunking Naturalism

But the Resurrection has another dimension that is often forgotten by the Christian. It totally dismantles the naturalistic worldview and debunks its fundamental assumptions. This view, so commonplace in our society (and vigorously espoused by many in the scientific community), sees everything through the "lens of nature" and contends that nature is complete in and of itself. To put it another way, "naturalism" sees nature as the ultimate reality, and nothing else is needed to explain the world in which we live.

Followed to its logical conclusions, man is nothing more than a material being, the most complex animal on the evolutionary scale. Life is defined as that interval of time between birth and death, and when we die, we cease to exist. In short, after death, we are nothing more than a "memory" to those left behind, and any hope of life after death is foolishness in the extreme.

The naturalist argues that there is no "force" or "being" out there that has caused nature's existence or has any influence on how it expresses itself. Thus, the idea of a god that has any role in impacting or coordinating the affairs of nature is ludicrous. If there is a god, he is unknowable, and even if he does exist, there is absolutely no reason why we should concern ourselves with him. Not surprisingly, any alleged reality referred to as the supernatural is meaningless, and the idea of life-eternal is an oxymoron. Further, the "laws of nature" preclude any possibility of the miraculous.

Re-infusing "Life" Into 100 Trillion Cells

The Resurrection, though, clearly challenges such notions. Consider for a moment what is involved in bringing a dead person back to life. Not only are we talking about re-infusing "life" into the cells of this person's body so that he is identical in appearance and function to what he was prior to death, but the complex biochemistry of each of these cells is also restored so that they can adequately carry out their precise and diverse activities (some cells responsible for brain function, some for cardiac function, some for digestive activity, etc.). And we are not just talking about a few hundred, or even a few hundred thousand cells, but probably as many as 100 trillion cells (what most scientists believe compose the human body).

The *power* necessary to make this happen is foreign to anything with which humans are familiar, not to mention the *knowledge* required to ensure that every chemical reaction necessary for optimal cellular function is fully up and running for each of these trillion-plus cells.

Further, if the body we are discussing belongs to Jesus, this power would also have to extract Him from His tightly wrapped graveclothes and enable Him to exit from a tomb whose entrance is blocked by a two-ton rock and guarded by Rome's elite military, all without being seen in the process.

Finally, the means by which this power and knowledge are exhibited assumes a *mind* to make it happen. And the mind responsible for these actions has to have the *authority* to initiate them and ensure that no detail necessary to bring this corpse back to life is overlooked.

The only person who has such a mind and is able to guarantee that this power and knowledge is carried out precisely as planned and executed in such a way that nothing can thwart its efforts is *asovereign God*, and not just any god, but *the God* who created this universe and all that it entails. There is no way that such a resurrection could be "pulled off" through random, indifferent, or impersonal processes so characteristic of naturalism's view of the world.

Eternal Life

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Four assertions logically follow that undermine the assumptions of the naturalistic worldview:

First, if the Resurrection is true, there is a God. He is not a figment of the imagination, but a real being. The only adequate explanation for Jesus' resurrection is that a sovereign God was responsible for its occurrence.

Second, the Resurrection clearly demonstrates that there really is a realm of reality that can only be described as supernatural. While humans may not understand it or have the means of studying it as we do the natural world, the Resurrection puts to rest any misgivings regarding the existence of the supernatural. This single event validates once and for all the certainty of a supernatural order of reality.

Third, the miraculous is no longer in dispute. If God can raise a dead body to life, He has already demonstrated that He can supersede nature's laws to accomplish His purposes without interrupting the stability of the cosmos in the process. If there was ever any doubt about the possibility of miracles, the Resurrection has proved that doubt to be unfounded.

Not only did the resurrection affirm the existence of a sovereign God, but it also indicated that there is a supernatural realm of reality, that miracles can and do happen, and that eternal life is a solid and not a capricious hope.

Fourth, Jesus' resurrection also validated the concept of the eternal. The Resurrection declared that death has been defeated and that life after death is no longer a theoretical concept but a surety.

The idea that death is the end of man's existence has now been overthrown. If a sovereign God could raise Jesus from the dead, why is He restricted from raising others from the dead, you and me included? Life after death demonstrated in Jesus' resurrection is no longer just an irrational wish, but a certainty.

While it is true that our salvation was achieved and everything that Christ did on the cross on our behalf was validated, it is equally true that the meaning of who we are as recipients of God's grace and the magnificence of His majesty also became crystal clear on that day. Not only did it affirm the existence of a sovereign God, as if there were any doubt, but it also indicated that there is a supernatural realm of reality, that miracles can and do happen, and that eternal life is a solid and
