The State of the Church Address

The State of the Tampa Bay Presbyterian Church is unified, stable, and growing.

Let me give you a bird's-eye view of some statistics for our church during this past ministry year, 2023 to 2024.

Worship attendance grew from 143 to 149, a growth of 4.2%.

Communicant membership grew from 171 to 176, an increase of 2.9%.

Giving to the General Fund grew from \$366,059 to \$399,965, an increase of 9.3%.

Giving to the Missions Fund grew from \$49,413 to \$59,108, an increase of 19.6%.

Giving to the Benevolence Fund grew from \$20,316 to \$25,133, an increase of 23.7%.

Our **mission** is to bring people to Jesus and *membership* in his church family, develop them to Christlike *maturity*, equip them for their *ministry* in the church and *mission* in the world, in order to *magnify* God's name.

Our church officers spend a great deal of time shepherding the members of our church family.

The officers also had a retreat this past spring to seek the Lord regarding our priorities for the coming year. The officers believe that the Lord would have our church give attention to the following:

• Hire an Associate Pastor for Youth and Family. Bert Barber and his team have done a great job with the youth. However, we have yet to hire a Youth Director. Nevertheless, the Lord has blessed TBPC financially this past year, and we have almost a full year's compensation to hire an Associate Pastor for Youth and Family. The congregation approved the Search Committee to commence the hiring of an Associate Pastor, consisting of the following members: Ken Pothoven, Toney Sauls, Ashleigh Kemp, and Mike Cacioppo.

- Building & Grounds. The Diaconate has identified several areas that need maintenance and improvement, such as gutters, roof, paint, sign, landscaping, cross/steeple, shade canopy, water sprinkler, and more. The officers believe the best way forward is not to take a piecemeal approach to maintenance, repairs, and improvements but to look at the entire structure of our property. In addition, some of our members have recommended that we add a new sanctuary. Considering all that, the Officers have contracted with a consultant to help us accomplish that goal. The Session has agreed with Incipio Consulting to provide and coordinate to evaluate the church's current financial position, space usage, and building maintenance needs and develop that into a "Scope Document" for contractors to price. Incipio will also provide a preliminary design/financial evaluation for a future larger facility.
- **Handyman**. The officers think it would be great to have a handyman, especially with increased growth and maintenance needs.

I am grateful to God for how he uses the Tampa Bay Presbyterian Church to glorify him and grow his people. Let us keep praying for that to continue.
