Advent: The Unexpected King

When I was a child growing up in South Africa, there was one radio station that my parents listened to all the time. The radio was often playing in the morning as we got dressed and ready for school, and then ate our breakfast. Every 1st of December, the music on the radio station became Advent and Christmas music. There was a countdown to Christmas. For a child, it was a very exciting time.

I don't recall learning about Advent while listening to that radio station. However, I do know that I learned about Advent when I came to the United States.

Advent is a wonderful time of the year as we particularly focus on preparing for the birth of Jesus Christ.

This coming Advent Season, I would like to preach a series of sermons that I am calling "Advent: The Unexpected King."

Throughout the Bible, births often herald great hope and expectations and are the result of great faith in God. Many births are a foreshadowing of the greatest birth of all, the birth of Jesus Christ.

The first week, we will focus on the birth of Isaac. Pastor Simmons will preach this message. Isaac's birth teaches us that what God promises will happen according to God's timing. And just as Isaac was born according to God's timing, so Jesus was born according to God's timing.

The second week, we will focus on the birth of Moses. Moses is a type of Christ whose life and ministry point people to Jesus Christ.

The third week, we will focus on the birth of John the Baptist. John the Baptist was called to make a way for the coming Christ, Jesus, and he began doing this even before he was born.

I hope you will join Pastor Scott Simmons and me as we examine "Advent: The Unexpected King" this Advent Season.

Men's Fishing Trip

On November 18th, 2023, the Men's Ministry had their seventh inshore fishing event located at the Gandy Bridge docks. It was again a wonderful time as we had a lot of new fishermen this year. We had 14 men, and 2 young men attend the fishing trip this year. We scheduled the event originally for November 4th, but there was a fishing tournament, and we did not want to have lots of boats on the water. The weather was excellent with a high of 77 and we were on the water by 8 AM with a temperature of 68 degrees. We had 16 and we chartered 4 boats this time and the fishing was average and a lot less fish caught than in 2021. There were many species caught this year, including snook, ladyfish, trout, catfish, lizardfish, flounder, a small shark, and several needlefish. There were more ladyfish caught of all the species, but we had a good variety of fish this year. Those present at the fishing event on boat #1 were Michael Bridges, Steve Mercia, John Hutton, and Steve Nordahl. On boat #2 was the entire Simmons family with those present Rev. Scott Simmons, son Everet Simmons, and grandsons Luke Simmons and Ethan Simmons. On boat #3 we had first timers Ben Sun and guest Xingang Cai, Jose Negro, and Dildar Gajadhar. Finally, on boat #4 we had Mike Cacioppo, Derk Shultz, Ken Smoot, and Brian Carrier.

It was a partly cloudy day with the sun peaking out of the clouds at times. It was not too cold and not too hot, but exactly right for our fisherman. The Lord provided yet another perfect day to catch fish, although they were biting a little, not as much as in past years. We caught approximately 50 fish total among 4 boats, but we had a bonus this year. We caught 2 seagulls and 1 duck. The seagulls were caught on boat #2 by Luke Simmons and on boat #4 by Derk Shultz. The duck was caught on boat #4 by Ken Smoot and when Ken grabbed the duck's neck for a picture, the duck threw his wings open for a perfect pose. Nice job, guys, to make sure you covered the sea and the air this year.

The captains that guided our day were Captain Brian Betancourt (Bubba) on boat #1, on boat #2 with Captain Mark Gore, on boat #3 with Captain Frank Diaz, and on boat #4 with Captain George Jonah.

This trip was extremely exciting as the captains recommended that we fish out in the middle of the bay as there was a strong current that was moving through the bay and out of high tide. There was a light breeze that made the day cooler and did not allow the sun to bring a lot of heat to the trip. We started in one area and the biting was sporadic for boats fishing farther away from the land. We were trying to catch mackerel and brought more ladyfish in this area. Some of the boats were separated from other boats to try and give more opportunity for the fishermen to have more bites of fish. This was not to be as the fishing was sparse most of the day. It was still a fun fishing day for all the men with some activity for everyone on the water.

This year we did not have a grand champion as the counts were about the same with 4 fish caught being the top of the day. The fishing for each boat had at least 1 person catching 4 fish. Boat #4 had a bonus catching a seagull and a duck.

We finished about 1 PM and proceeded to lunch. The final finish to the day was to go to a local restaurant where all the men enjoyed a nice lunch together at the same location as last year, the Salt Shack on the Bay. The food was excellent, and the view was even more amazing. There were a variety of items chosen including burgers and sandwiches with some seafood ordered which was appropriate for the day.










Boat #4



HelloOo, Parents!

Do you know all the words to *Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star*?....How about *Happy Birthday*?...And *Jesus Loves Me*?

Sure, you know them! Do you know why? You learned them as a child when your mind was fresh and eager to learn new things, and you learned them to music!

For several years on our Sunday School, we have used *Ask Me WhoOo*. It's the music of a three-volume CD set with Scripture and the Children's First Catechism, both word-for-word. It is so easy to memorize as a singalong! *Ask Me WhoOo* has been included in Sunday School for Toddlers through 5th Graders underscoring our *Show Me Jesus!* curriculum. Yes, Toddlers! Don't under-estimate those little sponge brains!

Now, there's an exciting NEW part! Kids who are signed up for Sunday School this year who memorize and recite or sing will about 13 Q&As and verses each quarter will earn Bucks up to...

\$25 Media Bucks or 2-3 year-olds for Bibles. Christian books, music, or videos.

\$50 Media Bucks for 4 year- olds through 2nd Graders.

\$100 in Camp Bucks or Media Bucks towards Christian camp 3rd through 5th Graders.

Perhaps the most important part of all of this is that we will be grounding our Covenant children in the basic tenants of our faith. I know it's no surprise to you that young people today are bombarded with lies that lead them astray. Even children who have grown up in church, too often leave later. They don't know what they believe. If they don't know what they believe in, they will believe in anything. The culture these kids are growing up in is broken and evil. Satan wants to destroy our kids! Record numbers of our kids are depressed and committing suicide because they have no solid biblical foundation.

A 2022 study¹ focused on the Gen X, born 1960 - 1980 produced some shocking statistics:

70% listed themselves as Christian on surveys, but -

44% never read the Bible.

63% said Right from Wrong was "situational."

31% never go to church.

57% never participate in a Bible study.

33% do not believe that the Bible is the Word of God.

According to this same study, "If someone has robust religious experiences growing up, they are likely to maintain their beliefs and practices into adulthood."

At the baptism of our Covenant babies, we all raise our hands and pledge that we will help the parents to raise the child up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. But unless we are Sunday School or Children's Church teachers or Nursery workers, we don't have much interaction with the young ones. However, one of the most rewarding experiences I've had in this church was taking part in the *Pray for Me* campaign. I had two sweet boys to pray for. In my interaction with them, I asked each of them how I could pray for them. It was so rewarding! I really got to know them when otherwise I would not have.

So how can you help in keeping our young ones in church, and in the Word? Our TBPC Family has 21 Toddlers through 5th Graders who are children of TBPC members. We pray each one will be enrolled and in regular Sunday School attendance this year! That means we would need 21 volunteers to be "Coaches," (or "Buddies"), to listen to the children recite the memorized Scripture and Catechism. For you to volunteer would mean no study or prep time, very little extra time at the church, and no special skills. Just love, interest, and prayer! This is a such great way to get to know a one of our TBPC kids and for one of them one of them to get to know you. This only involves a few minutes after church, plus listening and evaluating a recitation once a quarter. We also plan to have an all-church *Ask Me WhoOo* Sing-Along at the in May.

Our kids will memorize quickly as they sing *Ask Me WhoOo* each week in Sunday School, at home, in a park, or in the car with parents and sibs or even by themselves. The *Ask Me WhoOo* Song Time during the Second Sunday Evening Service each month will make memorizing easier still! Right now, we also need four more for our Sunday School Team, Teachers and Assistants! since we only have half of the teachers we need. Most of all, we need parents to be committed to bringing their kids each week to Sunday School and to be listeners and encouragers for their kid as they practice reciting or singing what they have learned.

Let's to bridge the age gap at TBPC! We need everyone to pray as we kick this program off in the In September. Ask God what He wants you to do to help to rescue our children. He has a job for each of us!


